


Hallelujah! Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; his faithful love endures forever (Psalm 106:1; CSB).

Dave Shelley recognized for 14 plus years as DOM at WCBA. Congratulations and we hope you enjoy retirement!






Lebanon Christmas Parade
