As one pastor in our association says, "It's the Superbowl of Sundays." Ideally, every Sunday should be like the Superbowl. It should be prayed up, planned well, and presented with excellence. Oh, but Easter Sunday is an awesome time and an opportunity not to be wasted.

Here are some easy wins to consider, if you haven't already:

If you don't have greeters, this is a great chance to start some type of hospitality ministry or make any significant strides in training those who already are serving. Train them to think like someone new to the church. They don't know where things are and they are likely a little nervous. Train them to be searching people out proactively and not only being friendly but making friends.

Signage is always a win and you can almost never have too many signs. Yard signs, billboards, church signs, people in the parking lot with welcome signs, etc.

Please, dear friends, don't make jokes about the Christmas and Easter crowd. Thank God for them and use this opportunity to help them move deeper into obedience and into your church.

Canvassing still works. Studies show that canvassing and door to door evangelism are not as effective as they once were, but they are still highly effective and possibly even more effective when done appropriately. I have a friend that pastors a church of 1200 who, before Easter, sent out hundreds of people to personally invite every home within 2 miles of their church to Easter Sunday. That Easter they welcomed more than 3000 people as a direct result (and saw nearly 250 return guests in the following weeks).

I'm praying for your every service but, I'm praying hard for your Easter. May God bless you and your faith family. May you see a great harvest as a result of your preparation. May God be glorified, the Church be edified, sinners evangelized, and Satan horrified.
