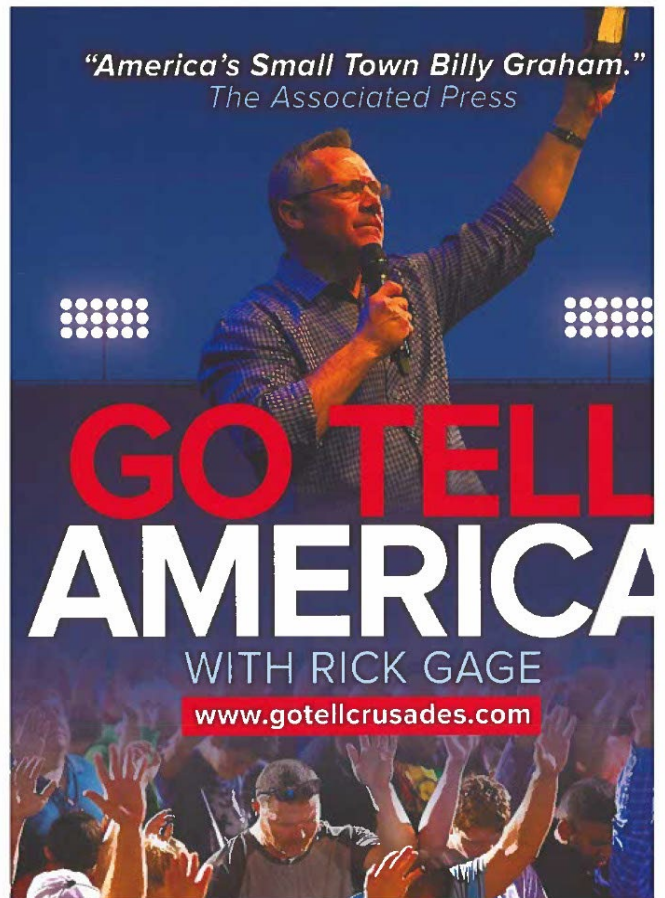

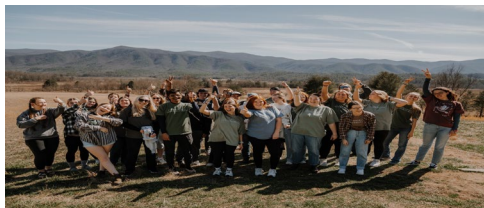
March was an absolutely incredible month here at your friendly neighborhood Cumberland BCM! The month started off with the greatest highlight of the semester so far! Our spring break trip. We travelled to Sevierville Tn and worked with several local ministries, helping with flood relief, food banks, and even prayer focused evangelism on the Gatlinburg strip! We took 34 students throughout the course of the week, 4 of whom are international students! We studied the armor of God, learned about spiritual warfare, and grew closer to God & closer together as a group. Scott and I both had several Gospel centered conversations with the students. All in all, it was an incredible week. Throughout the rest of March, we also have had a worship night, coffee cart, game nights, our Tuesday lunches, and Tuesday night bible studies!

As our semester comes close to a close, we are sprinting towards the end of the 2024/2025 School Year! April is a month full to the brim with events and for our students, it is their last chance to bring up grades & their GPA for the semester! Excitingly, we also are inching closer and closer to our BCM Summer Missions Trips. We will be traveling to Toronto in late May to serve with Send missionaries and will be headed to work at Tanalian Bible Camp in Alaska in mid June! As we prepare for our trips, we ask for your prayer and support once again! Our students are doing their very best to fundraise by sending support letters, selling T-shirts, cutting out their regular dosage of Starbucks, and in a variety of other ways, but at the end of the day, our ministry is comprised of college & young adult students, most of whom do not have a job yet due to their school schedules. However, they have felt the call to go and serve our Lord on mission and are trusting that He will provide!
